

#### **REMINDER ABOUT LOCAL TFR'S**

A reminder to our members: Due to homeland Federal security concerns. the Aviation Administration (FAA) has placed Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs) over certain events when they are occurring. Pursuant to 14 CFR Section 99.7, commencing one hour before the scheduled time of the event until one hour after the end of the event, aircraft operations are prohibited at and below 3,000 feet AGL within a three nautical mile radius of any stadium having the seating capacity of 30,000 or more people in which a Major League Baseball, National Football League, NCAA Division One Football or Major Motor Speedway event is occurring. When obtaining a briefing from Flight Services, the briefer will not tell you if there is an event that may affect your flight. It is up to each pilot to know if there is a scheduled event that maybe occurring in his or her intended flight path. PHPA has provided links to both Dodger and Angel schedules so you may easily obtain that information. Also, remember that the Disneyland TFR is 3,000 feet and below and three miles effective 24 hours a day. Don't jeopardize your certificate by not being informed.
