Prior PHPA President Di Giovanna receives accolades at HAI Convention

Capt. James Di Giovanna, Commander of Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Aero Bureau, has been awarded the Helicopter Association International's (HAI) 2003 MD Helicopters Law Enforcement Award. This award was presented March 16, 2004, at HELI-EXPO in Las Vegas, Nevada, during HAI's 43rd annual "Salute to Excellence" awards ceremony.

Di Giovanna has over 30 years of leadership and experience as a professional law enforcement officer in California. Through the Airborne Law Enforcement Association's (ALEA) Unit Manager's Course, he's instructed more than 400 students. In 2002, as the ALEA Training Director, Di Giovanna reorganized and added several classes with a renewed focus on safety and professionalism.

As Director of Flight Operations for the LASD Aero Bureau, Di Giovanna completed three aircraft upgrade evolutions that involved all the bureau's helicopters. He introduced three new model aircraft that required extensive procedures development and new technology training. Di Giovanna also created and implemented the Airborne Microwave Video Downlink program used by the Los Angeles Sheriff and Fire Departments. As Commander the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Aero Bureau, Di Giovanna is responsible for 68 sworn and civilian personnel, 16 rotary, and three fixed-wing aircraft in a program that flies 10,000 hours per year, and has a \$10 million annual budget.


