With over 35 years of experience in rotor-wing operations Ray brings a unique resource to the PHPA organization ... and our members!

Ray Prouty received a BS and MS in Aeronautical Engineering from the University of Washington. Starting in 1952, he spent 35 years in the helicopter industry working for Hughes, Sikorsky, Lockheed, and McDonnell Douglas as a helicopter aerodynamicist. He has written a college-level textbook, Helicopter Performance, Stability and Control and from 1980 to 2000 wrote the Aerodynamics column for Rotor&Wing magazine. The first 12 years of these columns are available as Helicopter Aerodynamics from Helobooks.com. A similar column now appears in Vertiflite, the magazine of the AHS. Since retiring in 1987, he continues to keep busy in the helicopter field by writing, consulting, and teaching short courses. He is especially concerned with helping pilots understand helicopter phenomena.

FLYING HIGHER

The PHPA is saddened by the death of Bill Dvorak, of Air Logistics. Mr. Dvorak died in a helicopter accident, on August 17, while landing on an oilrig in the Gulf of Mexico.

Mr. Dvorak first began flying while in the U.S. Army. He was a Warrant Officer serving as a pilot on helicopters flying medical evacuation flights in Vietnam where his helicopter was shot down and he was awarded the Army Air Medal 11 times and a Purple Heart. Mr. Dvorak left the Army in 1972 as a Captain.

Mr. Dvorak graduated from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, where he received his Air Frame and Power Plant Mechanic rating. Mr. Dvorak then worked as a helicopter pilot flying to oilrigs in the Gulf of Mexico, herding cattle on ranches in Texas with his helicopter, performing helicopter utilities patrols, and he worked as a helicopter mechanic. Mr. Dvorak was most recently employed with Air Logistics, in New Iberia. Louisiana.

While Bill served as President of PHPA, he was instrumental in our increased association with HAI and assisted in running a number of HAI arrival and departure heliports during the years that convention was held in Anaheim.

A graveside service was held Monday, August 22, at Mountain Home National Cemetery. Full Military Honors were provided by the Tennessee National Guard. Mr.Dvorak is survived by his wife, Dona Peifer Dvorak, their sons, LTJG William Travis Dvorak (U.S. Navy) and Josh Dvorak, and his parents, William John and Dorothy Sobeck Dvorak. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the Dvorak family.
