We here at PHPA have been inundated with calls from citizens complaining about low flying helicopters of every description (Media, Police, Fire and Private aircraft).

Those of us who own and fly these aircraft need to become even more proactive. We need to ask ourselves if there is a better way of covering the story, monitoring the chase, or fighting wildland fire. Most of the time the answer is Yes ~ sometime the answer is No. We all know that a little more altitude with fewer circles over a noise sensitive area can and will make a difference to those on the ground. Transitioning along the freeway at a slightly higher altitude and closer to the center line will mask the noise for those who live on the hillsides. It's the little things that make a difference. If we take a few simple measures, we can fade into the background noise that we all hear everyday here in the Los Angeles basin and have learned to dismiss as the norm.

I implore each and everyone of you take a look at your own daily routines, your routes of flights and the altitudes that you are flying and ask yourselves; what I can do as an individual to mitigate the effects of noise that I could possibly be creating by my own actions.

I, myself, have found that a few hundred feet of altitude can make a big difference in my noise signature and I now look for, and fly over the less populated areas at a reduced power setting whenever I am enroute to home base from a call or during routine administrative flights were high speed isn't of the essence. It's the little things that each and every one of us does to mitigate noise problem that will add up to make a big difference in the overall picture.

Be safe and noise sensitive when you fly.
